# Chairmans Report

Kia ora tátou,

The Surf Lifesaving Northern Region (SLSNR) Board have put a huge amount of work in over the year. I thank our Board for challenging the status quo and having the fortitude and foresight to drive for improvement by putting in a new staffing structure at Northern Region. We have now seen the benefit of this. As with any change it comes with a number of challenges and I thank the SLSNR club delegates for giving us the support to bring in change. Also the 2013/14 season has seen great progress and has culminated in an updated strategy plan, business management plan and a finalised budget. This will ensure we have structure in place and ensure our progress for the next three to five years. As always this is up for review as we continually look for improvement.

It has been heartening and rewarding to see the growth and progress being made by our clubs across the Northern Region in the 2013/14 season. However in saying this there are still a few clubs struggling behind other clubs. Please work with SLSNR so we can work together to improve on areas of need. We have continued to see our membership recruitment maintained, and continuous review of development and delivery of the essential programs that support our clubs, members and most importantly, the high quality of water safety and lifesaving services that we provide. This continues to improve and expand to meet the growing and diversifying population of our region. Our nipper programme is a fantastic success story with most clubs having large numbers of 7 to 14 year olds. The challenge will be to integrate them into our patrols. Implementation of a Diversity project and the consolidation of our Event Lifeguarding programmes are further evidence of our continual desire to innovate and

improve our reach in our communities and the services we provide.

The governance challenges between Surf Lifesaving New Zealand (SLSNZ) and SLSNR are well and truly sorted out. SLSNR will continue with constitutional and governance independence. The SLSNR Board is very clear we will protect SLSNR assets, be in charge of our own destiny and protect our ability to plan for an increasingly complex and demanding future. However we will always align and work with SLSNZ to enhance Surf Lifesaving.

As stated above significant work has gone in to consolidate the organisational structural changes from 2012/13 and leveraging benefits from those changes has continued. Whilst the planning and activity to support a sustainable financial future for SLSNR continues to be a critical challenge we are confident and results to date show the changes made are paying dividends. SLSNR will go into the next season in great health.

In working through the strategic and re-organisational implications of our planning for the future, I would like to personally acknowledge the positive and energetic nature of our membership. I would also acknowledge and thank Pam Elgar our CEO, the impressive work of our volunteer committees, including our Board, and the support of our SLSNR staff team—all contributed greatly to our progress this season.

I would also like to formally thank our sponsors and funders who have supported us over the past season and over the past years. As the population we serve in the Northern Region continues its significant rate of growth and associated diversity, the importance of your support also grows.

On behalf of the Board of Surf Life Saving Northern Region, I would like to express our gratitude for the dedication, participation and passion of all of our patrolling club members, whose skill and sense of duty defines us as a movement.

# CEO's Report

The 12 months covered by this report has been a year of consolidating the structural changes agreed in the previous year. At the core of everything we do is the provision of a high quality service to the public through the delivery of our programmes and services. We work to ensure these are delivered in a cost effective manner to the satisfaction of our members, funders and our many stakeholders.

Our organisation will always be judged on the effectiveness of our beach patrols and the surf lifesaving services we provide through our clubs and through the regional services we deliver. We can be proud of the work undertaken over the 24 week season.

330 people owe their lives to our outstanding Lifeguards and the invaluable service that they perform.

## GOVERNANCE AND ORGANISATION

The Board continued its work to ensure SLSNR remains a strong self-governing, self-administering and financially sustainable organisation.

We are proud that the ethos of 'Volunteer Led—Professionally Managed' is clearly demonstrated in the governance structure of our Board supported by four Operational and two Standing Committees who provide the vital element of ensuring that the views and expertise of our members and clubs are utilised in the delivery of our programmes. Thank you to all the volunteers who give their time and wisdom to support the on-going development of SLSNR.

Implementation of our structural changes, whilst challenging, has begun to deliver the results we were looking for. Namely, increased income, increased focus on delivering to our strategic goals and more rigour around operational efficiencies. We have developed a better understanding of our insurance needs and have a successful partnership with ASB Community Trust as well as building other key relationships.

## CLUB SUSTAINABILITY AND LIFE SAVING

The strength of our clubs is at the core of all we do and the collective effort of the 17 clubs has resulted in some truly remarkable outcomes. Our ability to achieve the outcomes below was strengthened by the growth in our membership which was up by 3% or 184 members.

This season we served 83,147 patrol hours, delivered 330 rescues, performed 858 first aids and assisted with 150 searches. 99% of the activity at our beaches is geared to prevention—stopping people getting into a situation that may demand a rescue—and the 25,648 preventative actions undertaken directly helped 89,667 people remain safe.

Every season, there are times when our Lifeguards are asked to put themselves into dangerous situations in order to save others. Or as in the case of Bethells Beach SLSC, who won Rescue of the Year, it can be the demands of the sheer number and types of rescues they have in just one day on patrol. We must commend all of our Lifeguards for what they do and encourage and assist them to continue to develop their skills to ensure they are equipped to handle any situation that may arise.

Demand for our lifesaving service continues to grow. We must ensure we are ready to face the challenge.

The paid weekday Lifeguard service covered 24 beaches and employed over 104 seasonal staff. The busiest beaches were patrolled for 15 weeks.

## SPORT

Our athletes continue to enjoy competing both as individuals and for clubs.

At a regional level, our competitions were well attended with 282 entries in the Northern Region Pool Champs, 582 entries for the Northern Region Champs and 585 entries for the Northern Region Junior Surf Championships.

The Northern Region Championships were again successfully held at Ruakaka. The decision was made however, to run the Northern Region IRB Championships as a separate stand-alone event. The separation of these events proved successful with great numbers still attending and much more manageable programming.

The SLSNZ National Championships were held at Ohope Beach, Whakatane, and Northern Region Clubs performed well.

At the completion of three days of thrilling competition it was fantastic to see that Red beach placed 3rd, Piha 4th, Orewa 7th and Mairangi Bay 9th in the overall points table. Muriwai took out 1st place overall in the Boats points.

The following Northern Region athletes were also named in the New Zealand High Performance Open Squad from which the World Champs Team will be selected: Rachael Clarke (Piha), Steven Ferguson (Piha), Teneale Hatton (Piha), Chanel Hickman (Mairangi Bay), Nick Malcom (Mairangi Bay), Danielle McKenzie (Mairangi Bay), Chris Moors (Red Beach) and Kevin Morrison (Mairangi Bay). The following Northern Region athletes were named in the New Zealand High Performance Development Squad: Kelsi Boocock (Red Beach), Scott Fairbairn (Mairangi Bay), Jake Hurley (Mairangi Bay), Matt Thetford (Red Beach) and Hannah Williams (Red Beach).

The 2014 World Champs New Zealand Youth Team was also announced and the following Northern Region athletes were named in the team: Kelsi Boocock (Red Beach), Jake Hurley (Mairangi Bay) and Hannah Williams (Red Beach).

There were some outstanding performances by Northern Region athletes at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships in Perth. Chanel Hickman (Mairangi Bay) took out the Open Women's Beach Flags beating nine times Champion Melissa Howard. Danielle McKenzie (Mairangi Bay) won a silver in the Open Women's Tube rescue and bronze in the Open Women's Board Relay. Kevin Morrison (Mairangi Bay) took silver in the Open Men's Tube Rescue.

In mid-July the 2014 World Champs New Zealand Open Team was named and this included Chanel Hickman (Mairangi Bay) and Danielle McKenzie (Mairangi Bay). Jason Pocock (Mairangi Bay) remains as Assistant Coach and Steve Vaughan (Mairangi Bay) is Assistant Team Manager.

Sport is key to our recruitment and retention strategy. It provides a fabulous opportunity for our Lifeguards to practise their skills in a competitive environment whilst keeping their physical fitness at peak standards. We are thankful for the great athletes we have and will work hard to ensure we continue to develop this part of our organisation.

It would be remiss not to mention the officials, coaches and administrators who give their time to provide the framework for competitions to run efficiently. Thank you all.

### JUNIOR SURF

Our Junior Surf programme is a real strength of the region and is a fantastic programme supported by a large number of officials and helpers. 2013-14 saw significant growth by 14 clubs in their Junior Surf programmes. Increasing the numbers involved in Junior Surf from 2150 to 2412 in the past year.

The Northern Region Junior Surf Championships was again held in Orewa. This provided a great platform for those Junior Surf athletes who went on to compete at Oceans 14.

At Oceans 14 Northern Region Clubs performed very well with Red Beach placing 3rd, Mairangi Bay 5th and Orewa 6th in the overall points table.

### WORLD MASTERS GAMES 2017

This year we had an opportunity to bid to be part of this fantastic event in 2017. Thanks to the great work of our organising committee: Mark Weatherall, Wayne Franich, Travis Mitchell, Duane Dalton, Simone Spencer, Sue Brewster and myself we have secured this opportunity. Start talking to all your friends and previous competitors and get them involved. This is a not-to-be-missed opportunity to be part of the largest event to be hosted in Auckland in the next decade.

### FUNDING

No community organisation can function without the support of core corporate partners, sponsors, funders, donors and supporters. We are extremely grateful for all the support we have received over the 2013-14 year. Without this support the exceptional level of programmes and services delivered by Surf Life Saving Northern Region would not be possible.

Special thanks must go to the Auckland Council who provided \$1,140,000 (some 40% of our overall regional funding). \$310,000 of this is distributed direct to clubs as operational grants. We received further funds toward lifesaving and club operating costs from another six Territorial Local Authorities (Hamilton City Council, Waikato Regional Council, Waikato District Council, Far North, Kaipara and Whangarei District Councils) and we thank them for their support also.

Our principal gaming funder, Trillian Trust has continued its support committing over \$276,000 in addition to grants made directly to clubs. This is a major contribution and one that SLSNR sincerely appreciates. Thanks must also go to NZCT, Lion Foundation, Pub Charity and the Tennyson Trust who have supported us with significant grants this year.



Toyota Financial Services have been an invaluable supporter of our service by providing great vehicles for the SLSNR team as well as being naming right sponsor for our annual Awards of Excellence. Yamaha NZ has also contributed greatly to our organisation through the provision of a six month lease ATV vehicle free of charge to the winner of our Club of the Year Award. This is a significant benefit to the club. Congratulations to Whangarei Heads SLSC—this is the first time they have won this coveted Award.

## LEADERSHIP

The second Regional Leaders for Life programme was delivered with three members from our region participating. We look forward to seeing the outcome of their projects. The diversity project developed as part of the 2012/13 year programme and we are seeing real benefits from the implementation of this programme with eight new lifeguards now in place and more students coming through the programme. The engagement of four west Auckland schools aligned with four west Auckland clubs and funding from NZ Lotteries Grant Board has been superb. The Governor General was very supportive of the project and hosted an official launch of the programme in June of this year.

The Senior Leadership camp was again delivered to the 20-40 year age group. This also proved very successful and we will now provide this programme on a bi-annual basis. Thanks must go to the dedicated volunteers who gave their time to help deliver this programme.

## SURF EDUCATION

We have experienced excellent growth in this area. We recognise we have a unique capability to provide three programmes in Surf to School, Beach Education and City Nippers. These programmes are ably delivered by our specialist instructors through collaborative arrangements with our clubs and has resulted in the education of over 10,000 school children in safety at our beaches.

We will continue to emphasize and grow this area as confident children and alert parents help ensure safe beach experiences. Our focus for 2014/15 is to have another 10% growth and to expand City Nippers to Bucklands Beach.

## FINANCIAL

The financial statements detailed in the Annual Report represent another solid performance from the organisation in a challenging financial environment. Income was up from

2012/13 year, attributable in the main part to the growth in grant funding, NZLGB funding, bequests and very tight financial controls. A net surplus of \$88,573 has been achieved.

We were again able to provide our clubs in Northland and Waikato with operational grants from our own income to ensure funding parity to all our clubs.

I would like to specifically thank Fiona Little for her attention to detail in managing the accounts of SLSNR over the past year and the on-going oversight and guidance provided by Board member Susanna Stuart.

## GOING FORWARD

Economic conditions indicate that the donor/sponsor/grant environment will remain flat at best based on feedback from a range of our funders. SLSNR updated our strategic plan and will be focusing on our key platforms of thriving clubs, quality lifeguards, community education, sport and the transformation and strengthening of our organisation.

2014/15 year is going to be another demanding year financially. We have a significant project with the impending narrowbanding requirement and upgrade of our Radio Communications Network. Alongside this we are hopeful that the Surf 10:20 facilities build programme will be confirmed in the Long Term Plan and our clubs will be able to focus on their re-building plans. The Health and Safety reforms will also require careful work to ensure we are best placed to manage the implications of these at a regional and club level.

## CONCLUSION

This year has been challenging as we have moved the organisation forward on a number of fronts. I am extremely grateful to our Board Chair as well as all the Board members for their support.

Specific mention must be made to the staff of SLSNR who delivered outstanding results in difficult circumstances. Thank you all. The staff changes that have occurred have meant we have lost some truly outstanding people and I wish to acknowledge their contribution.

I am proud to be part of Surf Life Saving Northern Region.

# Lifesaving Report

The 2013/2014 season has been a busy one for the Lifesaving Operational Committee (LOC) and we have seen some positive changes in the LOC. With the addition of Paul Downey, Simon Bell and Lindsay Hill, we reached a full LOC complement for the first time in four years. I believe that this is due to the increased focus we have on LOC in the Northern Region and making sure that we are putting our region first through proactive processes and forward thinking policies.

This season saw Tom Burgess move on to a role outside of surf. We were sad to see Tom go, but grateful for the hard hours he has put into Northern Region and I'm sure we have not seen the last of him for a while yet. Tom has been replaced by David Butt, who is no stranger to anybody and we look forward to the positive impact that David brings. Similarly, LOC lost Tony Featherstone to Australia. I'd like to thank Tony for the hours of work he has dedicated to LOC and to Northern Region as a whole.

Northern Region lifeguards continue to lead the country for volunteer hours worked. Last season, we patrolled over 80,000 hours. In a fantastic turnaround, rescues, preventatives and people involved in preventatives are all down on last season, so I'm hoping that the proactive beach management that is in place will re-establish this downward trend and that the increase in the 2012/2013 season was an anomaly.

The ASB Trust application process is now in year two of the three year grant. The majority of clubs are working hard to get

rid of old and unserviceable equipment. The guaranteed spend, that the three year commitment from ASB Trust gives us, is helping to drive this. Clubs need to make sure they are planning any big ticket items early, so that they can work with LOC on planning requirements for the next round of funding applications.

The National Lifesaving Committee continued to focus on issues of national import. Northern Region LOC will continue to work with the NLC and try to ensure alignment where possible, but as with last season and this season, we are introducing our own initiatives when we are ready to do so and we will work with NLC to help them to catch up, particularly in areas of event safety and support services.

Momentum is going to be key for the coming season. Continuing on the back of the last two seasons, we need to ensure our guards are equipped to cope with the many challenges they will face and to ensure we continue to project a professional image, while keeping the public and our members safe.

I'd like to thank the LOC for the hard work that has been put in this season. Lauren, Leif, Paul, Lindsay and Simon, you have been fantastic and your continued passion and enthusiasm will see Northern Region move from strength to strength. I have decided to step down after four years as Chair of LOC. I have enjoyed my time and I have learned a great deal. I'd like to thank all those who I have worked with and who have helped me and challenged me. Passion is never far from the surface in Surf and we wouldn't have it any other way. I feel that our region is in good hands and I wish you all the best.

It has been another successful season with an increase of junior members in 14 Clubs across the Northern Region. It is incredible to see our junior members learning new skills in Surf Safety and training for regional events.

The first interclub carnival was held at Red Beach on Saturday 7th December. There was a great turnout of juniors competing in a variety of events. The conditions and weather were challenging however the programme was completed.

The 2013 year started well with another very successful interclub carnival at Waipu Cove on the 12th January. Beach sprints, surf races, board races, diamond person and board and cameron relays were all completed on the day.

The Northern Region Junior Surf Championships and Cath and Eddie Millar Cup for 2013 held at Orewa saw 585 junior athletes participate in individual and teams events.

The Twilight events were run as a series over the season. This allowed for an overall winner across all events to be decided. The first twilight was held at Mairangi Bay with the second one being held at Orewa. This proved very popular in the lead up preparation of many C Group athletes for the SLSNZ National U14 Championships Oceans '14.

This season we have again reaped the benefits of the highly trained event safety guards present at all events held throughout the region. Ensuring the safety of all in the water and the skills of setting perfect buoy lines and the ability to move with the change in conditions throughout the day's events assisted in the smooth running of events.

2013 saw an additional two qualified level two Officials in Junior Surf along with numerous level one Officials being signed off.

## YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CAMP

This year once again saw the successful Youth Development Camp run on Motutapu Island. This camp continues to be a great starting point for our young lifeguards to network with members from other clubs and learn valuable skills to increase their capabilities as lifeguards. ## INTERMEDIATE GUARD SCHOOL

It was good to see a number of candidates who had been on Youth Development Camp either this or last season on this school and starting to progress and build their skills as lifeguards, as well as working their way through the pathway to becoming a highly skilled

## SENIOR LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE

The Senior Leadership Experience was run again this year in central North Island and saw 18 members head down for a variety of different activities and experiential based learning opportunities. Once again this was not just targeted at lifeguards, but at the wider membership, and presents a unique opportunity for some of our other volunteers within our organisation that might not be in the role of an active lifeguard. A huge thank you to everyone who helped run this course again this season. Taking our members away from the beach requires a lot of organisation and your help is greatly appreciated. In particular, I would like to thank Matt Williams, David Butt and Nicole Fearon for heading away with the candidates and keeping everything running smoothly.

## SLSNZ LEADERS FOR LIFE

SLSNZ Leaders for Life programme was held again this year, which had three participants from Northern Region attend. The course, which is run and managed by SLSNZ, aims to bring young leaders from within Surf Life Saving together to enhance leadership skills and qualities. As part of this programme, the candidates worked in groups on specific Surf Life Saving projects, with these presented to club, and district representatives in the second week of August. Congratulations to Dan Short of Mairangi Bay, Rory Futter of Bethells and Gracey Monteith of Piha for completing this course. ## BUDDY LUCAS SCHOLARSHIP

### TERMS OF REFERENCE CHANGE

Recently a change to the terms of reference was put forward to the board for approval. This change would see the DOC to align itself more closely with the strategic plan of SLSNR, in particular, the thriving clubs goal. This will see the DOC increase its focus, to not only include the development of our members, but to include the development of our clubs. By doing so, this will bring opportunities to train up and coming

# Sport Report

Another season has flashed by with some memorable events being successfully held in mostly favourable conditions bar one. It would seem that the King of Rangitoto event may have a weather voodoo hanging over it as it was cancelled due to poor weather for the second year running.

With the introduction of athlete registration at all of our events plus the checking of athlete eligibility, we can now accurately track growth and retention of all member groups competing at our events. A valuable tool for sponsorship in the future, tracking membership movements and health and safety. This season has seen movement upward being driven by a number of factors. Junior members migrating into senior ranks, retention of members in their late teens and the quality of the events being run by Northern Region. With the formation of a dedicated Event Safety Squad now in it's third year, the setup and safety at events has been improved tenfold. Now an integral part of every event we hold.

The Whangamata Classic, a carnival jointly run by Northern Region and the Bay of Plenty would appear to be a permanent fixture on the calendar. A large number of clubs from around the North Island now travel to this event for some valuable pre Christmas competition. Reflecting the need and the quality of this event.

Our District Champs at Ruakaka again showcased our local athletes, competing against each other and a number of clubs attending from out of region providing the last opportunity for all to race in favourable conditions before the New Zealand Champs. Ruakaka as a venue has served us well over the seasons with the assurance that an event programme can be fairly competed and completed over a weekend. A must for

an event of its size as it consistently sits at the 500 entry mark which is steadily trending upwards.

With the National Champs at Ohope, Northern clubs performed with distinction. The racing conditions were considered by many to be some of the best encountered for a number of seasons. A full programme successfully completed, our athletes knew that their medals won were well and truly earned. Four Northern clubs featured in the top eight on points and a large number of our athletes were selected for National Squads. Testament to our strength in the sport.

The 2014 World Champs New Zealand Youth Team was also announced and the following Northern Region athletes were named in the team: Kelsi Boocock (Red Beach), Jake Hurley (Mairangi Bay) and Hannah Williams (Red Beach).

There were some outstanding performances by Northern Region athletes at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships in Perth. Chanel Hickman (Mairangi Bay) took out the Open Women's Beach Flags beating nine times Champion Melissa Howard. Danielle McKenzie (Mairangi Bay) won a silver in the Open Women's Tube rescue and bronze in the Open Women's Board Relay. Kevin Morrison (Mairangi Bay) took silver in the Open Men's Tube Rescue.



In mid July the 2014 World Champs New Zealand Open Team was named and this included Chanel Hickman (Mairangi Bay) and Danielle McKenzie (Mairangi Bay). Jason Pocock (Mairangi Bay) remains as Assistant Coach and Steve Vaughan (Mairangi Bay) is Assistant Team Manager.

The Red Beach Sirens Open Women's Boat Crew also earned New Zealand caps this season racing in Australia in the annual Surf Boat test series between the two countries.

It was also very pleasing to see Muriwai take out the overall top Boat Club at the National Champs.

Congratulations to you all.

An event on the horizon, 2017 to be exact, is the World Masters Games. To be held in Auckland and of which Surf Life Saving will be a part of and contested at Takapuna Beach.

# Surf Education Report

The season 2013-2014 has been another stand-out season for Surf Education, especially for the Beach Education programme. This achievement can be attributed to the hard work and dedication of the whole Surf Education team. The Lifeguards that teach the Surf Education programmes are very passionate and committed and deliver the programmes in a way that children are not only engaged but also entertained along with learning fundamental surf safety theory.

## PREVENTION OF DROWNING AND INJURY

Surf Life Saving Northern Region's mission is to protect our community in the water by preventing drowning and injury. One of the SLSNR strategies to achieve this is through educating the community about water and beach safety. SLSNR has provided Surf Education programmes for many years and our priority is to grow the participation in all the Surf Education Programmes.

The three education programmes that are run in the Northern Region are: Beach Education, Surf to School and City Nippers and there has been a substantial increase in numbers in the last two seasons.

In 2012/13 there was a 33% increase in school students participating in Surf Education programmes and, this season, we increased the attendance yet again by another 20%. SLSNR's core focus is on Beach Education as this programme is delivered on the beach and in the surf and provides the children with the practical experience of learning surf safety in a beach environment.

## KIWI SPORT

Reasons for the increase in Beach Education attendance are the success of the new booking system and the funding received for KiwiSport in the Harbour Sport area, Sport Waitakere area and in the Waikato.

This quote from Glendene School says everything about the importance of the Beach Education programme and the importance of the KiwiSport funding for low decile schools:

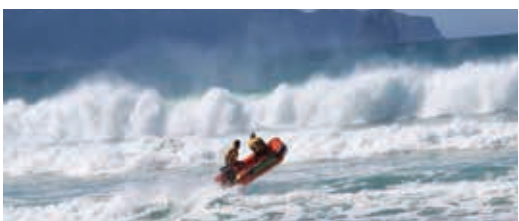
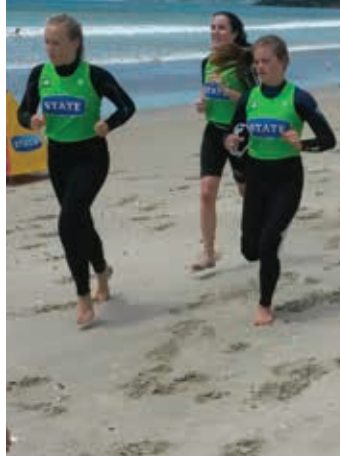

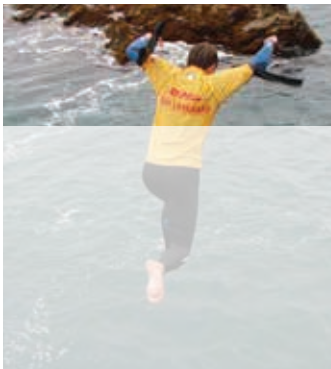

# Karekare

I would like to thank all our lifeguards, volunteers and club members for the work you have done in the past year.

Keeping our beach safe this season has been full on; with 4 lean patrols operating on what can sometimes be minimum numbers. Access to the club has made it particularly difficult for members to come down to the beach and patrol, especially our members with young families.

As well as rescues our clubbies have also been involved in fire fighting, with a significant blaze on the local hillside and also with a number of first aids, some in difficult to access locations. Treatment and transport of patients still remains an issue, and hopefully will be resolved if/when the new access way is built.

Following on from the successful 2012-13 season, the club has had another great competition season in 2013-14. Our two open men's, masters men's and open women's teams had success at the NR interclub carnivals, The Whangamata Classic, Eastern Regional and Northern Regional Championships, and strong performances at the Nationals. We are continuing our upgrade of surf sport equipment with additional skis, boards and a new canoe purchase budgeted for this coming season to accommodate the expanding competition team.

Our Junior Surf programme continues to flourish with a great group of rookies progressing towards becoming lifeguards.

In the past few years we have returned the club to profitability, at the same time investing heavily in upgrading our assets to provide a strong platform for growth.

The club has suffered for the past three seasons with the inaccessibility to the club and beach having a significant impact on our operations and all areas of our membership.

I am pleased to announce that both short and long term solutions have been agreed with the Council and this will provide a catalyst to rebuild our membership. There has been an immense amount of work gone into this by Stephen Pye and myself and many others over many years.

The work involved in resolving beach access has curtailed work on the building project. Now that this is resolved we will return to the top of the building priorities for SLSNR. Latter this year we expect that funding will be agreed by council in the Auckland Long Term Plan and along with other funding already agreed we will be in a strong position to establish a final time line to move forward on. In the mean time we have completed some upgrade work on the club to ensure it is a more comfortable environment for the upcoming season.

Two years ago we changed the club structure and I believe the new structure has strengthened the governance of the club and helped us identify the type of club we need to be in the future to remain strong and vibrant. Work on rebuilding our finances, access and developing our facility plans has taken some focus away from our membership which has suffered and been difficult to rectify due to the ongoing access issues. A solution now is to train the clubs membership and culture needs to be our number one priority.

Another contribution to our lower fuel bill is our ATV usage, with lower hours being noticed logged on the machines. Please continue to look after the equipment we provide, I would have to say it is the best kept around.

## **SOCIAL MEDIA**

The club has had an increase in its social media presence. We all recognise that social media is a growing tool for communicating with internal but more importantly external stakeholders and interested parties.

The club has throughout the season shared its stories and achievements through both Facebook and Twitter.

## **TECHNOLOGY**

# Mairangi Bay

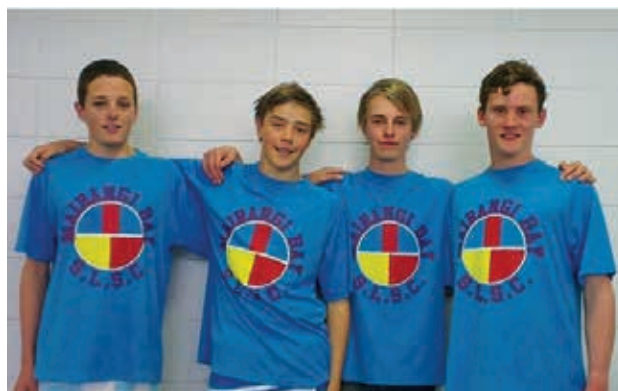
I wish to start my report this year by saying a massive thank you to all those who helped make Mairangi

The statistics are 3,314 volunteer hours; 563 Regional guard hours; 147 events management hours; 17 Rescues; 23 first Aids; 2 searches; 689 preventative actions warning 3,057 members of the public of potential dangers. Over the season 9 new lifeguard's qualified and 17 lifeguard's completed refreshers, 4 x IRB drivers were refreshed; five lifeguards's completed a patrol captain's course; and 16 completed first aid courses.

A special thanks to the patrol captains and the volunteer lifeguards who give up their time to train for patrol and to turn up on the day to keep our beach a safe place without the dedication of these members our club would not exist. ## COMMITTEE AND MANAGEMENT

# Muriwai

The 2013-14 season has been met with huge change to our committees and Management Board but throughout this change there has been great success in many different areas of the club. With the further addition of fresh faces and new ideas coming into our organisation moving forward, Muriwai Surf Lifesaving Club will continue to grow and prosper. This will further our aim to again be at the forefront in both the lifeguarding and sporting sectors within Surf Lifesaving New Zealand and indeed the world.

The patrolling season kicked off in earnest with refreshers initially as a mass club refresher and on patrol for those that missed this. While we managed to keep high standards we were also able to increase our club refresher numbers by 65% which will mean an extensive pool of lifeguards to call on next season. As always this is highly important because of

the large workload Muriwai lifeguards are faced with. Again the 2013-14 season was a busy one with three key statistics noted. A massive increase of nearly 50% of lifeguard hours worked showed that we are bucking the typical volunteering trend with many non-for-profits. In terms of activities, we saw a huge increase of first aids occurring which with our higher beach numbers and isolation will continue to be a major part of our operations. Finally, an exciting statistic to see was 45% drop in rescues even with the high numbers of beach goers, which represents a much higher level of proactivity in stopping rescues before they happen. Moving forward it is key to keep these trends continuing while bringing some of our other capabilities up to more acceptable levels.

Sport has seen another step up in results which will be a major goal moving forward. The pinnacle of the season was the winning of the top overall boat club at the New Zealand







Nationals. Huge congratulations and thanks must be given to those individuals which have had a huge part to play in this success including Chris Deacon, Ricky Butt, June Hardacre and Kendall Dooley. The next step is to ensure these winning ways continue moving forward while growing the rest of our sporting programme.

Junior Surf will see the retirement of Jayne McCall in her position of Junior Surf coordinator this season and I would like to take this time to personally thank her for her hard work she has put in over the past few years. We would also like to welcome our new sponsor Pak'n'Save Lincoln Road to the team, who will be helping fund our junior surf programme over the next five

I look forward to working with you all again next season.

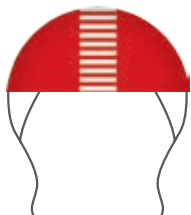

# Red Beach

For a club not normally known for its IRB exploits it was great to see the surfsports season begin with a September success in the 90 Mile Beach Classic and end with a May success in the Bay of Plenty Epic Long Haul race. In between these dates the club enjoyed its fair share of competitive success. The continued clean sweep of the Northern Regional Champs (Junior, Senior and Masters) couldn't quite be repeated at the Nationals albeit that a third placing following a second at the ERC's and another successful defence of the Owen Chapman Cup was a pretty reasonable result. A record 123 competitors represented Red Beach at this year's national champs returning with 32 medals including eight gold. These results were built on some great individual performances and once again a number of individual Red Beach athletes and crews have been recognised for their efforts including the Open Womens' Sirens boat crew who represented New Zealand in the Trans Tasman Surf Boat Challenge and Kelsi Boocock who will be off to France in September with the New Zealand Youth Team. It was also great to see a number of other Red Beach athletes competing internationally with distinction.

Away from competition, the season was again busy on both Red Beach and Pakiri beach with more than 3,700 of voluntary patrol hours clocked up across the two locations. Even with an additional 45 new lifeguards qualifying in the off season, maintaining patrols at two beaches over the height of the summer is not an easy task made even more difficult with the often competing demands of weekend surf sports carnivals. As always, a big thanks to all our patrol coordinators, patrolling members and especially a core of non competitors who were regularly required to hold the fort during carnivals. A win in the District Patrol Champs held at Mangawhai Heads was a nice bonus to a busy season of both competition and lifeguarding.

Our junior numbers and performances continue to auger well for the future of the club. At local level wins in the District Champs, Cath and Eddie Millar Cup and Rookie Challenge were followed at National level with a third equal at Oceans 14 in some very challenging conditions. While the competitive results are pleasing, of equal importance is the regular buzz



of activity down at the club on a Sunday morning as kids and their parents learn and enjoy all that surf life saving has to offer.

In addition to the funds generated by our bar and lounge facilities the support of our sponsors continues to underpin all our activities.

# Ruakaka

First of all I want to thank everyone in the club for helping me through my first year as president. It is an honour

to work with and on behalf of such a great group of people.

Before we started the 2013-14 season our committee took some time to discuss what the club means to our community and what we want it to be in the future. Committee navel gazing is not time I would normally credit with being well spent, but in this instance, I believe it was. While we all understood our mission is to provide a safe beach environment for fun and fitness we needed to think carefully about how we achieve that. How can small clubs such as ours sustain guarding services, junior surf, surf sport, and guard development for the long term?

Succession planning is critical; guards go off for work, Uni or OE's, families change or move and some of us even get older.

We are a club, not a business or a public service. We are the sum of our membership. The sustained success of our club depends on us recognising:

- Volunteering makes it all possible
- Volunteering is fun and fulfilling
- Everyone can contribute

None of the committee members are actually scary people but their experience and competence can be intimidating until you get to know them. My family and I came to the club without any surf club tradition (or skills for that matter) and found opportunities to contribute.

People have busy lives so this year we are going to prepare a full calendar of events and have that available by opening day. Many of those events require volunteer support. We will be maintaining event sign-up sheets in the clubhouse and the event leader will be encouraging club members to be involved.

We intend to propose more and more varied sporting and social activities but to minimise the strain on the event leader, we will cancel those events that do not generate sufficient member support in a timely manner.

The community and club demographics strongly suggest the current growth in our membership will continue. At this

rate, we won't be a 'small club' for much longer. We have a few changes to work through to make us a better club and prepare us for the future.

## GOVERNANCE RENEWAL:

First of all we would like to introduce a revised constitution. We have learned that our existing constitution, which was modified just last year, does not provide a best-practices framework for governance. Surf Lifesaving Northern Region has rolled out a constitution template that meets the current best-practice guidelines. We hope to have these changes made to present to the membership for ratification at a Special General Meeting at the start of season 2014 -2015.

Second, we have proposed that we start to plan on renewing our facilities.

## CLUB FACILITIES RENEWAL:

We are fortunate to have Ben McKernan, our Facilities Manager to lead this initiative. For the exterior we would like to put the main building on a foundation, redo the cladding and extend the decking. Inside, we would like to replace the floor, convert the largest bunkroom into a classroom to give us more space for functions, modify and refresh the WC's and facilitate wheelchair access. Some repairs and improvements simply couldn't wait and through the autumn and winter Derek has directed substantial upgrades to the water and wastewater systems.

The club has been on this site for 54 years. In another 54 years, the young nippers of today will see their grandchildren at play on a significantly changed New Zealand coastline. Recent estimates for sea level rise for NZ are in the 60 to 90 cm range by 2090. There is also new understanding of the frequency and severity of tsunamis affecting our coast. My point is there are big things looming on the horizon that should be included in our long term planning mix.

As a result of these deliberations, the committee has begun to set money aside into a Building Fund. We realise renewing the structure will be a very costly undertaking and it will be much easier to secure building grants as co-funding.

### OPERATIONAL RENEWAL:

Our goal is to have a safe beach environment: that means supporting safe beach and water use and providing guard services. Our junior surf and surf sport programmes instil the knowledge and practical skills that generates safe happy beach users, provides a development path for guards and keeps everyone interested, hopefully for life.

Perhaps the most visible change in Junior Surf and Surf Sports will be the use of high visibility vests for junior surf and surf sports and the introduction of some dedicated training gear such as yellow rescue tubes.

You are also going to notice we have some new equipment. The growth in interest in stand-up paddleboards has stimulated the club to purchase a stand-up board, which has been designed for rescue work. Also, the new bobcat will be commissioned and on the beach for spring.

The value of surf sports to develop our guards and retain interest and participation in the club from junior surf to masters cannot be underestimated. Our double-hulled canoe was well used this year, even competing in the Northern Regional Competitions off our own beach. We look forward to even more Surf sport competition in the coming year.

Once again we held the Northern Regional Champs here at our beach, it was a great weekend thanks to all the volunteer help. There is growing competition to host this event but thanks to Ben and all our volunteers, we have been awarded the Champs for 2014/15.

Neil did a superb job this year organising several events but he outdid himself with the Casino Night. While it was a successful fund-raiser I believe the greatest benefits came from enjoying a delightful evening with our members and supporters. Our young guards of today will be the croupiers of tomorrow.

Also of special note was in being selected by the Marsden Lions Club to share in the proceeds from golf tournament. For the Club – thank you Marsden Lions for such generous support and for those of us who had the chance to play, thanks for a great day.

We were again able to mount our full complement of three patrols under the leadership of our Club Captain Tania Ahrens. According to Tania, the lifeguards at Ruakaka had another wonderfully busy and successful summer. We had just over

40 Volunteer Lifeguards patrolling our beach this summer, who put in an astonishing 2658 patrolling hours, as well as our paid guards who did an additional 648 hours over the busy Christmas/New Year period. We had five callouts, five rescues, 20 first aids, eight searches and 347 preventive actions involving 1701 people!! So well done to us all!

Our club Lifeguard Instructor, Gretchen Gulick and her new Lifeguard Instructors qualified another 14 Lifeguards, so we are in good stead for our next season. It is a tough job managing all these keen young guards, but a rewarding one. And we are forever up skilling with first aid or IRB training to be the best we can be. So parents, please keep encouraging your wonderful teens to continue patrolling so that we can keep our beach safe.

I am delighted to remind you that our Powercraft Instructor, John Kearney was recognised as the Northern Region's Examiner of the Year in the recent 2014 Toyota Financial Services Awards of Excellence. Well done and thank you JK!

Notable achievements in guard development include attracting and training five new instructors. This has positive implications for life guarding at Ruakaka. The increased numbers of lifeguard instructors allows for more SLA Exams to be targeted during the lifeguard season. This has the potential to increase lifeguard numbers and club members. We have projected two exams so far- one being a pre-season and one occurring at the beginning of February. The instructors are all under the age of 20 which offers advantages with recruiting at the local high schools and maintaining interest in being active in the club at a guard level. This is the first year that we have organised a pre-season camp with the guards staying at the club for the weekend to build team unity and a sense of community. We plan to gather ideas about what the youth of our club would like to do with their patrols, etc. We have talked about visiting other clubs and to have other guards from outlying clubs come to Ruakaka to guard over the season.

The interest in senior guards has increased with parents seeing life guarding as opportunity to lifeguard with their teenage children. It is a fun way to be involved in their lives. Parents are also reliving their youth by coming back into life guarding after many many years of being away and they see it as a good time in their lives to give back to the community. Lifeguarding also offers the opportunity for parents and their



children to have some down time at the club with the use of the wonderful facilities.

Challenges we face include maintaining interest in guarding in current and future members so they want to come back each season- ultimately holding on to our membership numbers. Giving ALL guards the opportunity to develop themselves fully within the SLSNZ structure. First aid training, camps, courses, overseas life guarding, anything that allows them to develop (inter and intra) personal skills, leadership and communication skills. If we can get them excited about what the club has to offer and what the wider life guarding community has to offer then I believe they will stay at the club longer.

Our Equipment Manager Ryan Trounce worked tirelessly to maintain and build our equipment inventory. This season we all enjoyed seeing more of our gear out of the gear shed and in the water. The canoe teams are doing well and the committee will back them by increasing our capacity in this area. A number of our guards became interested in stand-up paddleboards, this has led to the addition of a surf rescue SUP, something the guards are becoming skilled on. In support of the increased interest in surf sports, both at a senior and junior level, Ryan is working to expand and upgrade our inventory of competition equipment. As regards patrolling equipment: Ryan has worked tirelessly to secure sponsorships, enabling significant acquisitions such as the upgrade to our Bobcat ATV.

Junior Surf is booming under the management of Nikki Thompson, our Junior Surf Co-ordinator extraordinaire. Sunday mornings are running more smoothly than ever

before. We started the year with our Open Day. I believe this has advanced the growth of junior surf by letting juniors and their families get a better understanding of the opportunities to be had for the season and beyond, from the onset. As someone who was not raised in surf lifesaving family, I know it takes some time to discover all that is on offer. We therefore hope to use this 'open day' to introduce parents and care givers to the opportunities to join in.

Thanks to our committee, coaches, helpers and our patrons Eric & Gladys whose many hands make it all work so smoothly.

Thanks to our sponsors, especially Refining NZ and our special guests representing the Marsden Lions Club at our AGM.

Thanks to Debbie Fong. Until I became involved in the committee, I really had no idea how much administration was required to maintain a club such as ours. Debbie keeps us running with great skill and diplomacy, which we all appreciate.

Special thanks to Derek Hulse for rejoining our committee; his counsel to the committee and his mentoring of me is deeply valued.

Finally I must apologise for not being able to join you for our AGM. I am abroad for family and work but I hope to see you all on the beach for the start of the season.

# Sunset Beach

The 2013/14 summer was highlighted by the club winning the New Zealand Rescue of the Year Award and the New Zealand Search & Rescue Council Certificate of Achievement for the rescue of ten rock fisherman on the 1st April 2013. A magnificent team effort over Easter on the last day of patrols for the year.

We provided volunteer lifeguards for 3,981 hours which was a record number since hours have been recorded. 7545 preventative actions took place and significantly, six beach audits were carried out by the SLSNR auditors and we recorded 100% marks on each of these audits. This demonstrates that the high standards for volunteer patrols that we set at Sunset are recognised by the independent auditors. We are very proud of our patrolling achievements and are committed to maintain these standards to the highest level.

The New Zealand Community Trust has been financially supportive of the club and has ensured that our IRB's and engines are replaced on a program that benefits the club longer term and that our competition team is funded to attend competitive events throughout New Zealand.

Trust Waikato as our principal sponsor continues to provide operational funding and specific project grants.

We are grateful to the Trustees for their support over many years.

Despite the beach erosion and the lack of car parking on the beach front our beach attendance numbers continue to grow as Sunset is discovered by more and more people as a very special west coast beach and with the strength of the Lifesaving service we have a safe swimming environment.

The funding of the operational overhead of the club continues to challenge us and as the overheads increase year by year so does our need for cash to sustain the service we provide to the public of the northern Waikato region. Submissions are being made to the Waikato District Council for additional financial support and we will continue with vigour our representations in the future.

My thanks to the volunteer lifeguards who give so willingly of their time to patrol the beach, the committee and the executive for the countless hours they give to administering the clubs business and finally the parents who support us all summer.

The Society qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and it is not large as defined in the framework for differential reporting. The Society has taken advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions except that a cash flow statement is presented.
