INTRODUCTION

The winners of nationally linked categories of the SLSNR awards will become finalists for the SLSNZ Awards of Excellence. Winners of Regional categories will be judged by one of the following; National Sport Committee, National Lifesaving Committee or SLSNZ Board depending on the award.

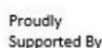

The Junior Competition Club of the Year trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Junior Division at the SLSNR Awards of Excellence.

CRITERIA

This policy applies to the following SLSNR Events. It does not apply to 'special' events.

JUNIOR TROPHY:

- SLSNR Pool Championships – Not Held
- SLSNR Junior Championships – Not awarded due to restrictions on event

DEFINITIONS

“club” means a surf lifesaving club, or community rescue service, as described in Rule 7 and Rule 7 in the SLSNR Constitution

“Members” means a person who is a current financial member of SLSNR as defined in Rule 5 of the SLSNR Constitution.

“Senior” members over the age of 14 with current Surf Lifeguard Qualification

“Junior” members under the age of 14

“Master” members over the age of 30 with Surf Lifeguard Award Qualification.

POINT ALLOCATION

Points will be awarded to the clubs that place first, second and third as detailed below. Each club that attends the competition and places outside the top five, will each receive two points for attendance. Clubs that do not attend will not be eligible for any points.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO EVENT LIFEGUARDING 2022

BACKGROUND

Contribution to Event Lifeguarding between July 2021-April 2022. The ideal person will have been instrumental in both the planning and delivery of the event lifeguard service, contributing heavily both leading up to events and at them.

Key considerations;

1. Commitment this season (operational volunteer contribution)
2. Number of events attended
3. Leadership and contribution within the team
4. Development undertaken as an individual to contribute to the development of other members in the team

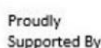

BACKGROUND

To recognise a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the development of lifeguard capability development during the 2022 season.

CONSIDERATION OF SELECTION

The most important area of selection is the contribution to overall enhancement of lifeguard capability development at all levels during the period May 1 2021 to April 30 2022.

The key areas to be considered are:

- Club and Regional Lifeguard training duties
- Local/Regional Examining duties
- Regional Schools (such as powercraft schools, intermediate lifeguard schools etc.)
- National Lifeguard School instructing
- Personal award development to improve lifesaving capability
- Community involvement in Surf Life Saving instruction
- Advocacy of Surf Life Saving / beach safety in the community
- Leadership of self and others

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EXAMINER OF THE YEAR 2022

BACKGROUND

- The level, quality and consistency of examination skills demonstrated
- The complexity of the role (Examiner, Senior Examiner, Examiner in Charge)
- Number of examinations attended. (Examiner in Charge has higher weighting)
- The development of new examiners in the region by recruitment, or mentoring of probationary examiners.
- Personal development undertaken to improve examination performance
- Advocacy of Surf Life Saving values and beach safety skills within the community
- Initiative shown through leadership (recommendation from the Chief SLA and IRB District Examiners)

The Training Advisory Group will review nominations to select the winner of the 2022 Examiner of the Year.

OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO POWER CRAFT 2022

BACKGROUND

As the rescue tool which undertakes 60% of our rescues nationally, powercraft are essential to Surf Life Saving New Zealand's lifesaving service. Powercraft includes both RWCs and IRBs This award recognises excellence in powercraft support.

CONSIDERATION OF SELECTION

The key areas to be considered are:

- Support of the on-going operation of powercraft at a club.
- Support of the on-going development of powercraft at a club or district level

PATROL SUPPORT OF THE YEAR 2022

The successful nominee will be seen as a role model for surf lifeguards and therefore should portray a picture of health, knowledge, capability, credibility and leadership.

The key areas to be considered are:

- Patrolling duties
- Award training duties
- Club activities specific to surf lifesaving services
- Regional activities specific to Surf Life Saving services
- Support of rescue related activities (Pertaining to that of a Patrol Support Member) i.e. – Radio Communications etc.
- Personal award development to improve lifesaving capability
- Advocacy of Surf Life Saving / beach safety in the community
- Leadership of self and others

The winner will be selected from all rescues from the area that were nominated for SLSNZ rescue of the month during the season.

SELECTION

The Lifesaving Advisory Group will review nominations made for Rescue of the Month in their area to select the winner. This will then go to the Operations Committee for approval of the 2022 Rescue of the Year. Please note: for the national BP Surf Rescue of the Year, each of the six winning national 'Rescue of the Month' recipients will be judged by the National Lifesaving Committee to decide the winner.

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INNOVATION OF THE YEAR AWARD 2022

BACKGROUND

To recognise a member, club, business or group who through innovation, have been able to enhance Surf Life Saving Northern Regions ability to achieve its purpose of 'the commitment to the prevention of drowning and injury in our aquatic environment, through the provision of lifeguarding, water safety and education services.'

CONSIDERATION OF SELECTION

The key areas to be considered are:

- Projects, Programmes or Products will be considered
- Must be original or not currently being done elsewhere in NZ
- Extent of impact on SLS is a consideration
- Projects developed or delivered solely by SLSNR or SLSNR committees are not eligible

SELECTION

The Honors and Awards Committee will review nominations to select the winner of the 2022 Innovation of the Year Award.

The most important area of selection is the voluntary contribution to overall enhancement of Surf Life Saving during the period May 1 2021 to April 30 2022.

The key areas to be considered are:

- Volunteer contribution to Surf Life Saving outputs at Club/Regional/National levels
- Governance and Stewardship
- Management and Administration
- Funding / Sponsorship
- Recruitment and induction programmes
- Image of Surf Life Saving
- Promotion and marketing
- Aspects of development or innovation that the member contributed significantly towards
- Demonstrated leadership by the nominee
- Personal development undertaken to improve volunteering performance
- Advocacy of surf lifesaving / beach safety in the community

SELECTION

The Honours and Awards Committee will review nominations to select the winner of the 2022 Volunteer of the Year. Each club is encouraged to nominate the clubs' winner of volunteer of the year for this award. One nominee per club.

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CLUB OF THE YEAR 2022

PURPOSE

To recognise Surf Life Saving Northern Region's highest performing club over the 2022 season.

OVERVIEW

EACH CLUB IS TRADITIONALLY AWARDED POINTS IN THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES:

1. REFRESHED LIFEGUARDS AND IRB DRIVERS
2. MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT
3. SPORT
4. JUNIOR SURF
5. OBLIGATIONS AND REQUESTS

2022 CLUB OF THE YEAR UPDATE

Please note that due to COVID restrictions over the 2021 – 2022 season restricting the events and programmes that can be run, Club of the Year 2022 is not able to be awarded in the traditional format and some areas will not have points allocated where outcomes haven't occurred.

A separate update will be sent out on how club of the year will be awarded in 2022.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Participation and achievement in Lifeguarding, Membership development, Surf Sports, Junior Surf and good Club Management practice

- Points will be allocated as per the number of clubs in the area (i.e. 17 clubs = 1st (17 points) to 17th (1pt)).
- Information gathered for the following categories will be taken on the dates as stated below.
- The winner is the club with the most points obtained over the 6 categories below.

1. REFRESHED LIFEGUARDS AND REFRESHED IRB DRIVERS

Clubs will be ranked 1st to last according to the number of Lifeguards & IRB Drivers refreshed as of the 30th March 2022 compared to the number of current members who hold these Awards on the PAM database.

2. MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Clubs will be ranked 1st to last according to the number of membership development awards (Instructors, Examiners, First Aid, Coaches, Surf Officials) gained through SLSNR and SLSNZ during the current season as a percentage of their total Club membership (excluding junior surf) from the current season. Awards will be taken from PAM on the 30th March 2022.

And all Clubs will also be eligible for 1 point for attendance at the Youth Development Camp (this is included in the point score to be divided).



(The recognised Awards are: Surf Lifeguard Instructor, IRB Instructor, Surf Lifeguard Examiner, First Aid Level 1, Developing Surf Coach, Competitive Surf Coach, Performance Surf Coach, Surf Official Level 1 and Surf Official Level 2).

3. SPORT

Clubs will be ranked based on the Competition Club of the Year points for Seniors, Juniors and Masters. The total points will be ranked 1st to last.

(To avoid an imbalance of points because of Clubs not participating, points will initially be ranked last to first).

4. JUNIOR SURF

Clubs will be ranked 1st to last according to the percentage growth in their Junior Surf Club membership (7 – 13 year olds).

5. OBLIGATIONS AND REQUESTS

a. Meeting Attendance

Clubs will be awarded 1 point for Club representation at each of the following (between the dates July 2020 – June 2021):

- AGM
- Club Delegates Meetings
- And any general meetings called by SLSNR

b. Reports/Documents

Clubs will be awarded 1 point for each of the following reports being submitted to SLSNR by the due date:

- Presidents Report
- Financial Report (Audited Accounts)
- Lifesaving Service Agreement
- Club Support Agreement
- Club Standard Operating Procedures
- Venue Hire Agreements
- Incorporated Society status (current with the Companies Office) as at 30th April 2022



SERVICE AWARDS 2022

SLSNZ's Service Awards programme aims to recognise the contribution of our members to surf life saving. The Awards covered are:

- Service Award
- Distinguished Service Award
- Life Membership

A points system is used to determine eligibility for these awards. Detail on the points scoring system is set out in the service form spreadsheet.

There are no limits on the number of applicants from a club.
