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POSITION DESCRIPTION

POSITION PURPOSE:

To manage the running of a lifeguard patrol, ensuring effective provision of the lifeguarding service. To monitor and advise beach and water users and to provide/co-ordinate rescue services as and when required.

Beach Management and Paid Lifeguards.

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KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- In training to become a Patrol Captain.
- Assist in implementing an effective beach management plan including the appropriate placement of flagged areas, signage and rescue equipment.
- Educate and advise members of the public on water safety.
- Rescue ready at all times.
- Patrol the beach(es) assigned to you with reference to the relevant NSOP's/CSOP's.
- Maintain club facilities and equipment as set out in the Paid Lifeguard Service Venue hire Agreements.
- Maintain a positive image for the Paid Lifeguard Service, SLSNR and SLSNZ in all dealings with the public and external emergency services.
- Maintain and enhance fitness and skill levels throughout the season.
- Complete, enter and forward all required paperwork and complete all administrative tasks on time.
- Complete statistical information and other reports required by SLSNR.
- Comply with SLSNR and SLSNZ policies at all times.
- Undertake a weekly induction/briefing with all lifeguards working at the beach.
- Implement an effective rostering process for the daily patrolling duties.
- Coordinate/facilitate lifeguard training and upskilling throughout the season.
- Ensure personal safety and the safety of your team.
- Ensure open communication with the PLS management and Club Liaison Officers.
- Promptly notify the PLS Management of any faulty equipment, staffing concerns and additional resources required.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

- Professionalism, maturity, initiative, organisational skills, decision making, honesty and reliability, able to perform in an unsupervised environment, leadership qualities, communication and people skills, capacity to work in a team, ability to follow instructions.

- 2 year of patrolling experience in a professional service.
- 17+ Years of age
- Must be a SLSNZ member (at time of employment).
- Current SLSNZ Surf Lifeguard Award (or SLSNZ RPL)

- Marine VHF Radio Award
- IRB Crew Award
- Complete online regional lifeguard theory test.
- Must swim 400m under 7 minutes 30 seconds.
- Must run 3kms in under 20mins.
- Complete Safeguarding Children Online Module (given during employment process)
- Complete Health and Safety Online Module (given during employment process)
